Hyde Park Past Moves to the Present

Recently retired branch librarian Barbara Wicker knew there was a treasure trove of Hyde Park historical documents in Weld Hall. After all, they had been accumulating since the Hyde Park Historical Society had been founded in 1887, 25 years before the town became part of Boston, and Nancy Hannan, as president of the society for 38 years until her death in 2008, had attended to the material donated by families and organizations throughout the years.

"I always knew the boxes had to be opened but couldn't do it when I was working full time," Wicker said. "So when I retired, one of the first things I did was join the Historical Society." Since July, she has spent dozens of hours organizing the archival material.

Her progress was greatly aided, she said, with the arrival of summer interns Andromeda Woodward, now a sophomore art major at Skidmore College, and Kayla Grant, a freshman at Middlesex Community College in the Hospitality Industry program.

The young women scanned pictorial data and typed textual information into a computer. Jeffrey Gonyeau, senior program manager for the Historic Neighborhoods Center Program of Historic Boston, supervised their efforts. Funding for the digitalization project came from Urban Edge, a community development organization.

Wicker added that BPL at Copley was helpful in many substantive ways. The buildings department refinished magnificent wood cases which will display the collection in a fitting manner. Ron Grim, Leventhal Map Collection Curator, and Hank Scanell, micro-text head, were helpful in the sensitive process of sorting and evaluating maps and newspapers.

"There are so many treasures," Wicker said. Among them are a picture of Sarah Grimke, believed to have been owned by William Lloyd Garrison, a picture of the "Hyde Park Club, June 17, 1895" (all men, of course!), and a picture made of human hair, a genre popular in the Victorian era.

The work of organizing, conserving, and presenting the material continues. The Historical Society seeks to make the many gems available for viewing by the public and for use by researchers, carrying on the mission the Society first stated in 1888: "the promotion of the study of history."

Sometime during October or November (the date will be posted at the library when it is set), the Nancy Hannan Archives Room behind Weld Hall will be dedicated by Mayor Menino. All are welcome to attend and celebrate Hyde Park History.

It's Our Birthday!

Join us on Saturday, January 23, 2010, from 11:00 – 3:00 as we celebrate the 10th anniversary of the rededication of the restored and expanded Hyde Park Branch Library. The Hyde Park Branch is the oldest branch building (NOT the oldest branch library) in the Boston Public Library system, in continuous operation since September, 1899. We also hold the distinction of being the only Branch that was erected as an independent town library before joining Boston in 1912. Celebrate our history as we reenact the dedication ceremonies from the year 1899 and 2000. Enjoy music, poetry, art exhibit and auction, children's activities and more.

As a special birthday present the Friends will be sponsoring a relighting of the original reading room with new energy-efficient bulbs (40 watt output while consuming 7 watts of power with anticipated life of 5 to 7 years). This green initiative was made possible by the Sylvania Electric Company and Standard Electric Company of Boston, who jointly donated fifty percent of the 100 bulbs for this project. The Friends of the Hyde Park Branch have generously funded the remaining bulbs (total 100 units). Join us as we light up the library for our birthday!
